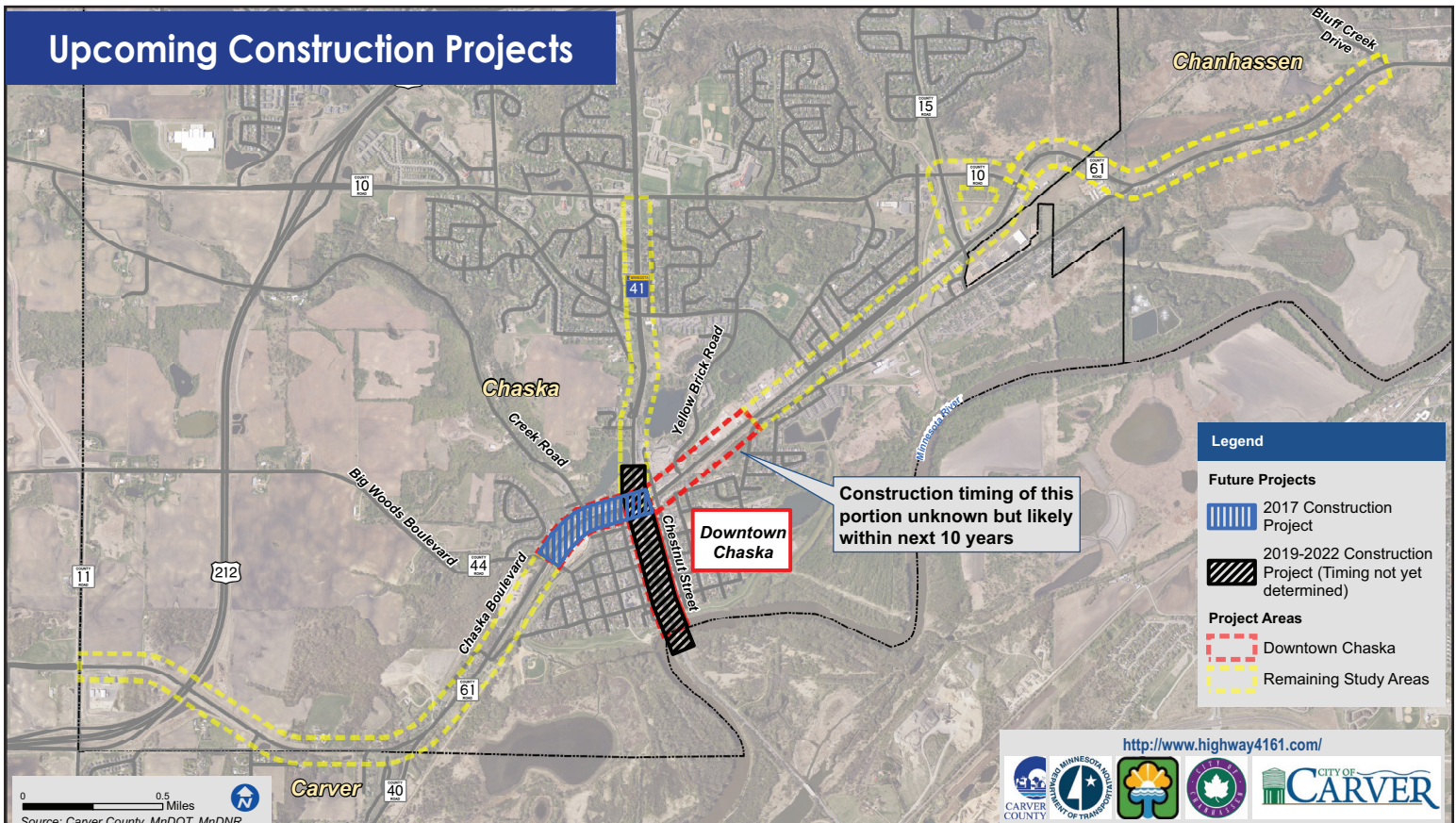
Project Update
