### Purpose & Need

- Purpose
  - Continue City-County partnership to reconstruct another regionally significant corridor in the City of Le Sueur.
  - Connects into other recently improved roadways.
- Need
  - 1. Replace the failing pavement surface
  - 2. Upgrade the underground utilities extension of new sanitary sewer main
  - 3. Improve safety for vehicles and pedestrians consisting of speed control measures and new sidewalks. LE SUEUR

  - New bumpout and RRFB crossing



### **Construction Process**

- Contractor "typical" sequencing in each block
  - >4 weeks of utility construction (sanitary sewer, watermain & storm sewer)
  - > 3 weeks of street construction
  - ≥2 weeks of boulevard restoration
- Temporary Water Shutdowns Temporary water system to be installed to maintain service during construction
- Temporary Access Restrictions No driveway access
- Maintained access to businesses throughout construction







### Tree Removals

- Boulevard Trees
  - Utility, Roadway and Sidewalk Conflicts
  - Health/Species
- Trees to be removed will be marked with "pink" ribbon and door hangars ahead of time

 Tree removal operations for entire corridor anticipated to be completed in early May







### Roadway Improvements

- Street Reconstruction
  - 5" Bituminous Asphalt Pavement (3 separate lifts)
  - 8" Aggregate Base
  - 18" Sand
  - B618 Concrete Curb & Gutter
  - 40' street width typical 11' thru lane + 9' parking lane
  - 44' street width "downtown" 12' thru lane + 10' parking lane
- Pedestrian Facilities & Boulevards
  - 5' concrete sidewalk
  - Seed for turf restoration








### **Detour Route**

CSAH 22 (TH 112 Turnback) Improvements Project - Construction Start Up (Le Sueur, MN): Proposed improvements on CSAH 22 (formerly Minnesota Trunk Highway 112) are anticipated to begin on Monday, April 20, 2020. The project is to include roadway reconstruction, utility improvements, and ADA upgrades. Initial operations will include the following roadway closures (detours will be marked/signed):

- Intersection of Bridge Street/North Main Street/TH 93
- Bridge Street between North Main Street and Fourth Street South Second Street between Bridge Street and Ferry Street
- Construction will begin with Stages 1A and 1B consisting of the reconstruction of Bridge Street and South Second Street (see map). A regional detour is planned utilizing Highwa 169 and County Highway 37 (Kingsway Drive). A local detour is planned utilizing Fourth

The following is an overview of the earlier phases of the project schedule. More detailed start dates will be provided as construction progresses:

- Construction will begin with the closure of the intersection of Bridge St/N Main St/TH 93, Bridge St between N Main St and 4th St and S 2nd St between Bridge and Ferry St (Stage 1A and 1B)
- Temporary water services installed to Bridge and South Second Street properties
- Removals and utility work (sanitary sewer, watermain, and storm sewer) within Stage 1A and

### Early/Mid May

- Concrete curb and gutter and bituminous pavement within intersection of Bridge St/N Main St/TH 93
- Reopening of intersection of Bridge St/N Main St/TH 93 (Stage 1A)
- Continued utility work (sanitary sewer, watermain, and storm sewer) within Stage 1B
- Tree removals throughout project area

Construction will begin within Stage 2A consisting of the reconstruction of Elmwood Ave

### **CONSTRUCTION NOTICE**

June 26, 2020

Pavement removals will begin on **Wednesday**, **June 27**th for Texas Ave. **Please do not park your cars on Texas Ave after 7 AM on Wednesday**. During construction, the contractor will typically start working around 7:00 AM and on-street parking will not be available during the working hours of 7 AM to 7 PM. If you need to leave for work past 7 AM you may need to park on another nearby street. Access to driveways will be restored at the end of each work day.

S.M. Hentges will begin setting up the temporary watermain next week on Texas Ave. The following week (7/2), the contractor then plans to connect the temporary watermain to your outside water spigot once pressure testing of the temporary watermain has been completed.
