

Streetscapes – the parts

- Travel Lanes
 - Vehicles
 - Bicycles
- Parking Zone
- Amenity Zone
 - Lighting
 - Landscaping/trees
 - Furniture
 - Signage
 - Café seating
 - Underground utilities
 - Buffer from travel lane
- Pedestrian Zone
 - Clear walking path
 - Cover from rain/sun
 - Direct tie to storefronts




Example of typical complete street section in a Downtown Area






Plenty of display windows

On-street parking = feeling of pedestrian safety










Streetscapes: Bicycle facilities
















Streetscapes: Places for gathering

Coordinated style


