



Funding Available for City Wastewater Connections

Why is this funding available?

The City of Randolph is developing a new wastewater treatment facility. Construction of the facility will be funded using state dollars, but the cost of connecting homes is the responsibility of each homeowner.

This funding has been made available for Dakota County residents to connect their homes to city sewer.

What is an eligible expense?

The cost of connecting a home with a failing septic system to a city wastewater treatment facility is considered an eligible program expense.

How much can I get to help pay for the connection?

Applicants can receive a total of 50% of the connection cost up to \$10,000.

An application for funding must be approved before work can begin, and all work must be done prior to December 31, 2024.

Who can use this money?

Funding is available to low-income homeowners who own property with a failing septic system that is eligible to make a connection to a city sewer.

While the program is designed for Randolph's unique situation, funding is not limited to Randolph residents. Most cities within Dakota County have some remaining septic systems, and all homeowners within the County who meet program requirements are eligible.
