Thanks for taking the time to read this letter of recommendation for the Grant funding application for the Rice Lake Corridor. We are a growing community that in the midst of vast change! Destination Fitness has been a staple in the city of Rice Lake for over 7 years. Within the last 2 years, we have had a few challenges in serving our members. The traffic on Rice Lake Rd has impeded the flow of traffic both in and out of our current entrance. There have been mornings where traffic from the intersection of Martin Rd and Rice Lake Rd has been backed up to our entrance where our members cannot exit our entrance without someone letting them squeeze in. As that traffic has grown, so has our membership base - to the point where we are expanding this coming fall! We are hoping to have easy access to our building and are so excited for the proposed alternate transportation trail planned for this area! As the City of Rice Lake continues to grow, I truly hope you pass the RAISE grant as it will greatly impact our community - a community we love and are committed to serving as well.

I am writing to support the RAISE Grant funding application for the Rice Lake Rd (CSAH 4) Corridor Project located in the cities of Duluth and Rice Lake, Minnesota. This is a cooperative project between St. Louis County and the City of Rice Lake to leverage transportation improvements for the development of jobs and residential opportunities.

This project will improve Rice Lake Rd, which is a County State Aid Highway, as well as other intersecting county roads along the project corridor. These roadway improvements include construction of roundabouts and implementation of robust access management strategies. Additional improvements include construction of a new city street and paved walking and biking trails. Because of the multi-modal emphasis of this project, any new development and the associated jobs would become more accessible to residents.

Recently incorporated in 2015, the City of Rice Lake has identified Rice Lake Rd as the corridor that will support its future commercial and mixed-use development in its Comprehensive Plan published in 2020. Rice Lake Rd is a key transportation corridor that serves the Twin Ports Metropolitan area. Without completing these roadway improvements, the vision of new development could not be supported by the existing roadway infrastructure and would therefore likely not be fully realized.

This project will be a once in a lifetime opportunity to develop a new community that supports jobs, new places of residence and a good quality of life, all in one place. I am committed to supporting St. Louis County as they develop this project which will improve the mobility and safety of transportation in the Rice Lake community. Thank you for your interest and support to improve Minnesota's transportation system.
