## PROJECT STATUS AND UPCOMING WORK

- For the week of June 24, expected work includes the following:
  - Watermain installation is expected to begin on Wednesday, June 26<sup>th</sup>, starting at 120<sup>th</sup> Street. With that, water will be shut down for a few hours to residents living between 12001 and 12225 Fremont Lane. We apologize for this inconvenience.
  - With the start of underground construction, there will be additional disruptions to vehicle access so be aware of where the work is occurring and proceed in the opposite direction on Fremont Lane.
  - CenterPoint construction continues with their gas main construction. The main line should be complete by early next week, with gas services continuing through the week.
- Please see to the care of children and other vulnerable individuals during construction and be aware of the movement of construction equipment so that everyone will be safe while the work is being completed.
- The project will certainly create inconveniences and frustrations for residents, so we ask for your patience while work proceeds with this important project.
