PROJECT STATUS AND UPCOMING WORK

- While the underground work is not yet complete on Terrace Drive and Isle Road, we are starting to see the roadway on Fremont Lane take shape with a portion of the curb recently going in. There's still considerable work to be done yet, but the light at the end of the tunnel is starting to appear.
- For the week of September 23, expected work includes the following:
 - o Water service construction on Terrace Drive.
 - Excavation and building of aggregate road base, working west on Fremont Lane and north on Terrace Drive to Oak Street, and west on Oak Street to Fremont Drive.
 - Curb and gutter construction on Fremont Lane, Terrace Drive to Oak Street, and Oak Street to Fremont Drive (tentatively scheduled to begin Thursday).
 - Keep in mind that after the curb is poured, vehicles will need to stay out of driveways until the curb is cured (along with the concrete driveways for those situations), which takes approximately 5 to 7 days.
- We appreciate everyone's patience during this construction process.
- Please see to the care of children and other vulnerable individuals during construction and be aware of the movement of construction equipment so that everyone will be safe while the work is being completed.
